

Your Honor may I address the court?

Under the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights of 1966 Part 1 Article 1, and paragraph 1. I, \_\_\_\_\_ first name \_\_\_\_\_ hereby declare my right to self-determination. I am a living (wo)man and a -  Foreign state,  Mexican;  Asian;  African;  Native; - American national. I am not a “citizen of the United States” because I am not a “free white person”.

Under the supreme law of the land the Naturalization Act 2 stat 153, Apr 14, 1802, one must be a “free white person”, the primary criteria required to qualify for the status classification of “citizen of the United States”.

As a foreign-state American national, I wish for this court to take judicial notice of my guaranteed unalienable rights due me under the Bill of Rights amendment of the Constitution for the United States of America of 1820, having only 13 Articles, of which Article 11 guarantees me foreign-state sovereign immunity from prosecution under State of \_\_\_\_\_ color-of-law by a private corporation, specially one having a Duns # \_\_\_\_\_.

Officially, because there was no sworn affidavit filed by an injured party under penalty of perjury the prosecution must drop charges.

I authorize the judge to dismiss the prosecution case for lack of jurisdiction.

In Conclusion, should your honor not dismiss this case with prejudice, I will wish exercise my right to:

1. Remove this case to Federal District Court on federal question of jurisdiction; and
2. File a cross-complaint in federal court against the parties signed on the complaint filed in this state court against me for their continuing civil and criminal violations of federal health laws under Public Law 92-500 Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendment of 1972, 86 stat 816 of 1372, specifically, section 2, section 306, (national standard of performance); sec. 2, Sec 307 (prohibition effluent standard and pretreatment standards); unlawful discharges of pollutants being committed daily in their homes and their work places in the nature of genocide and crimes against humanity as defined under the ICCPR, Article 3, Article 6, paragraphs 1, 2, and 3.

Public Law 92-500 sec 2, sec. 313 (federal facilities pollution control) confirms that not even the President has the power to exempt compliance of sec. 306 and 307.
